Sub: **Memorandum**

Sir,

With due respect, I on behalf of the Central Executive Members of the APDA would like to draw your kind attention & considerations to the following demands.

1. Early DPC for Super time Grade specialist:

The post of supertime grade specialist is lying vacant following the retirement of Dr B.C.Sharma recently. Being the highest post for the specialist sub cadre, the vacant post may be filled up by an eligible candidate by conducting formal DPC at the earliest.

Further it is realized that in the present APHS Rule 2000, there is no specific responsibilities assigned to super time grade specialist, who is of the rank of Additional DHS. Hence, the super time grade specialist may be allowed to look after matters related to – **Training centers, Medical Education, like- Higher studies (PG course), upcoming Medical College, General Hospitals (Naharlagun & Pasighat) and District Hospitals.** In order to discharge the above duties, a proper room with adequate manpower & infrastructure should be arranged in the Directorate.

The incumbent promoted to the post of super time grade specialist should relinquish the post which he was holding prior to the promotion to create avenue for the junior officer.

2. Early notification of Syllabus for recruitment of Medical Officers

Despite the approval by Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission of the Syllabus for recruitment of MO vide. **F/No. PSC/D-25/2009 dated 4th January 2010**, the department has failed to make a formal notification till date. Your intervention in getting the notification through will be highly appreciated.

3. Early notification of revised eligibility criteria for Govt. sponsored Post Graduation studies

The Govt. after realizing the drawback of the existing 5 (Five) years eligibility criteria for availing Govt. sponsored PG studies, constituted a sub – committee to review the existing guidelines. The sub – committee after thread bare discussion and taking into consideration various aspects recommended 3(Three) years of continuous service for the eligibility for Govt. sponsored PG studies. This recommendation of the sub committee may be accepted by the Govt. in order to help more young doctors from pursuing higher studies.
